How To Use This Transfer Guide

This guide provides an outline of the General Education Program course requirements that all students at UW-La Crosse must complete as part of their degree program. Students must earn a minimum of 42 credits of General Education (GE) courses.

This guide is only a sampling of courses from Normandale that will satisfy each requirement. The guide does not contain an exhaustive list of transferable courses. For additional course equivalencies, please visit www.transferology.com.

NOTE: This guide is primarily designed for students that are interested in transferring credits on a course-by-course basis. It is not intended for students planning to earn their associate of arts or associate of science degree, nor is it intended for students planning to complete the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC).

Associate of Arts/Associate of Science

Students transferring from Normandale Community College who have earned an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree are exempt from the UW-La Crosse General Education Program requirements. Students accepted under this policy are still required to meet all core, professional, major and minor requirements. In addition, the university reserves the right to review the student's associate degree and require additional general education courses.

Minnesota Transfer Curriculum

Students transferring from Normandale Community College who have completed the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) are exempt from the UW-La Crosse General Education Program requirements. Students accepted under this policy are still required to meet all core, professional, major and minor requirements. In addition, the university reserves the right to review the student's associate degree and require additional general education courses.

Transferology

Transferology is a nationwide network designed to help students explore their college transfer options. Courses displayed as "maybes" in Transferology **does not** imply a lack of transferability; it means UWL has yet to evaluate the course's equivalency.
