



Regarding your letter of admission...Your admission has been granted based on your past academic record and any courses in progress this year. Final admission is contingent upon:

- a) Receipt of a final official transcript that includes the grades (if applicable) from the semester you are currently enrolled and the posting of your degree must be on file in the Admissions Office by **June 10**. If you are also taking summer courses elsewhere, we must receive an official transcript with spring grades (if applicable) by **June 10**, and we must receive an official transcript with summer grades by **August 25**.
- b) Maintaining your current established grade point average. If you are currently enrolled and have an established grade point average, it is our expectation that you will maintain this grade point average. We do review final transcripts to check grades.

As a second degree student, you will not receive a credit evaluation. You will need to consult with the Dean's Office for the College to which you are assigned (see letter of admission) to determine which courses you need to complete to earn your second undergraduate degree. It is important to know that certain undergraduate programs are highly selective and applicants must meet additional requirements for entrance into these programs. Your letter of admission does not guarantee admission into any program of study. Additionally, students who have graduated from a regionally accredited institution other than UW-La Crosse must meet all core, professional, and major requirements for the second degree, and earn at least 30 resident credits beyond the first degree. You will work with the appropriate staff member listed above to determine program specific requirements.

- Shortly after you applied for admission you received an email from the UW-La Crosse Admissions Office which contained your WINGS username and password information. This information will allow you to log into your WINGS Student Center. You will use the WINGS Student Center to make registration and housing deposits, monitor receipt of required materials on the "to do list", and view your financial aid package.

What happens next:

- **Submit a \$100 registration deposit. The registration deposit is non-refundable and must be submitted before you can register for classes.** To make your registration deposit, log into your WINGS Student Center. Click the blue “Make a Deposit/Payment” link. Click “Make a Payment” from the top blue menu bar. Click “Registration Deposit \$100” on the right side. Choose the appropriate term for your registration deposit (for example, *Registration Deposit Fall 2012* if you plan to begin in the Fall 2012 semester). We recommend that you utilize the “e-check” payment method to avoid any convenience fees.
- After making the \$100 registration deposit, interested students can apply for **on-campus housing** by going to: <http://reslife.uwlax.edu/roomsignup/incomingstudents/>. You will be required to submit a \$75 housing deposit. On-campus housing is limited and assigned on a first-come, first-served basis.
- If you need information about **disability related services**, you may contact Disability Resource Services at 608-785-6900 or /V/TTY or visit www.uwlax.edu/drs.
- If you are a **veteran** and have questions about veteran’s educational benefits, you may contact the Veterans Benefits Coordinator in Room 117 Graff Main Hall or at 608-785-8751 to initiate any required paperwork.
- If you plan to **apply for financial aid**, the FAFSA application is available online after **January 1** at www.fafsa.ed.gov. You will need your completed Federal Income Tax information in order to complete the FAFSA. It is recommended that families use the “IRS Data Retrieval Option” when completing the income information sections of the FAFSA online. The priority date is **March 15** for consideration of all types of aid; however, applications are accepted throughout the academic year. You can utilize the Financial Aid Calculator at <http://www.uwlax.edu/finaid/calc.html> to estimate the amount of financial aid you might receive.
- **Minnesota residents** must apply for tuition reciprocity under the Minnesota/Wisconsin reciprocity agreement. Applications are available for the next academic year each April. Apply online at www.getreadyforcollege.org/hesod/reciprocity/apply1.cfm
- In **April**, you will receive information about **registration**.
- Fall 2012 semester classes begin on **Tuesday, September 4**.
