THE GAME: The University of Wisconsin-La Crosse (1-0) hosts Azusa Pacific University, Calif. (0-2) Saturday, Sept. 12 in the Eagles' home opener. Kickoff is scheduled for 1 p.m. at Roger Harring Stadium at Veterans Memorial Field Sports Complex. It is the first collegiate game played at the newly constructed complex.

ON THE AIR: All of UW-L's football games can be heard on WKTY Radio (580 AM). **Mike Kearns** will call the play-by-play with **Scott Erickson** providing color commentary.

ON THE INTERNET: All of UW-L's football games can be heard live as broadcast on WKTY over the internet. To access, a link to the broadcast is provided on the UW-L Athletics home page and on the UW-L Football home page.

ON THE PHONE: All of the Eagles games this season are also available over the phone. Fans can call (800) 846-4700 and enter code 8616 to catch all the action with the WKTY broadcast. This is a free service provided by the UW-L Athletic Department.

THE SERIES VS. THE COUGARS: UW-L leads the all-time series, 2-1, with Azusa Pacific University (Calif.). The Eagles won 27-10 in 2006 in Azusa and 27-20 in overtime in 2007 in La Crosse. The Cougars earned a 13-10 victory last season in Azusa.

HOME STADIUM: UW-L returns to campus to host six home games in 2009 at the newly constructed Roger Harring Stadium at Veterans Memorial Stadium Complex. The Eagles played four home games at Winona (Minn.) State University in 2008.

The Veterans Memorial Field Sports Complex has seating for 6,250 and includes a synthetic turf football field, a 10-lane track, new locker room space, press box, concessions and restrooms. The Veterans Hall of Honor is also prominently featured as part of the new stadium.

HOME RECORD: UW-L finished 217-69-9 (.751) all-time at Veterans Memorial Field. The Eagles recorded their 200th win all-time at Veterans Memorial Field with a 28-24 victory over South Dakota September 20, 2004.

UW-L was 89-18 (.832) in La Crosse since 1987, including 28-9 (.757) since 2000.

LAST ACTION: UW-L opened its season with a 28-13 victory at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5 in Marshall, Texas. The Eagles trailed 6-0 at halftime, but took a 7-6 lead on their first possession of the second half as **Reid Oldenburg** scored on a 48-yard run. On ETBU's next possession, UW-L's **Nicholas Matthews** forced a fumble and **Chris Anicete** recovered at the Tigers' 43-yard line. **Nick Anker** hit **Dan Sellers** on the next play from scrimmage to give the Eagles a 14-6 lead. ETBU cut the lead to 14-13 on a 69-yard touchdown pass with 10:35 remaining in the third quarter.

UW-L's **Blake Roemer** picked off a ETBU pass and returned it 16 yards to the Tigers' 42-yard line late in the third period. Anker connected with **Jacob Boegel** for 40 yards and Oldenburg scored on the first play of the fourth period on a three-yard run for a 21-13 advantage. The Eagles' **Derek Dreher** picked off a pass on the Tigers' next possession and **Jason Church** scored on a one-yard run on fourth down for a 28-13 lead with 9:48 remaining.

UW-L finished with 359 yards of offense, including 163 rushing and 196 passing. Oldenburg set career-highs in rushing attempts (24) and yards (139) while scoring twice. Lauters had 46 yards rushing on 10 carries. Anker was 15-of-30 passing for 196 yards with one touchdown. He was sacked three times.

Sellers set career-highs in catches (5) and receiving yards (71) while hauling in one touchdown pass. Maxinoski had four receptions for 50 yards and Boegel three catches for 60 yards.

ETBU totaled 200 yards on offense, including 80 rushing and 120 passing.

Dustin Drath, **Aaron Johnson** and **Derek Jones** each had six tackles for UW-L. Jones and Roemer each finished with 1.5 quarterback sacks with Jones having three tackles for loss and Roemer 2.5. Roemer also had an interception while Dreher had a pair.

THE HISTORY: UW-L is in its 96th season of football. The Eagles have compiled a 555-246-46 record against four-year institutions over the years (.682), which ranks as the second winningest program in Division III history percentage-wise, behind only St. John's University (.707). The Eagles' 555 wins ranks 12th on the all-time victories list for Division III.

THE COACH: **Larry Terry** (UW-La Crosse, 1977) is in his 10th season as head coach at UW-L. He is 58-36 (.617) overall and 42-21 (.667) in the WIAC at the helm of the Eagles. Terry is 83-65-1 (.560) in 16 years as a collegiate head coach. He led UW-L to three straight WIAC Championships and been named the conference coach of the year in 2002, 2003 and 2004.

Since Terry joined the Eagles' staff as offensive coordinator in 1988, UW-L has compiled a 174-61 (.740) record, won 10 WIAC titles, and made four national championship game appearances, winning two.

He earned his bachelor's degree from UW-L in 1977, a master's degree from Bowling Green State University in 1978 and added his doctorate degree from the University of New Mexico in 1990.

COACHING STAFF: Four members of the Eagles' coaching staff, including head coach **Larry Terry**, played football for UW-L. **Tim Ebner** (running backs), **Larry Noll** (defensive backs) and **T.J. Mickschl** (defensive linemen) were members of the squad in their undergraduate careers.

WIAC PREDICTIONS: The Eagles were picked to finish fourth in the 2009 WIAC Preseason Poll selected by the sports information directors. UW-Whitewater, which fell to Mt. Union College (Ohio) in the NCAA Division III Championship game last season, is picked to win the league title in 2009. UW-Stevens Point is expected to place second and UW-Eau Claire third. Following UW-L being chosen fourth, UW-Stout is picked fifth followed by UW-Oshkosh, UW-River Falls and UW-Platteville.

NON-CONFERENCE PLAY: After going 9-2 in non-conference play from 2003 to 2007, UW-L went 0-3 last season. The Eagles opened up non-conference play in 2009 with their 28-13 victory at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. UW-L fell to Hardin-Simmons University, Texas (24-23), the University of North Dakota (45-7) and Azusa Pacific University, Calif. (13-10) a year ago.

AZUSA PACIFIC: The Cougars, members of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) are coming off a 24-12 loss to the University of San Diego Sept. 5 in Glendora, California. San Diego led 14-0 before Azusa Pacific's **Ben Hansen** converted on a 22-yard field goal with :02 remaining in the first half to make it 14-3 at halftime.

Hansen hit a 41-yard field goal early in the final period to cut the lead to 14-6, but San Diego scored the next 10 points to take a 24-6 advantage. The Cougars finished the scoring on **Mark Berry**'s 64-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown with :46 left in the game. Azusa Pacific's two-point conversion failed.

Azusa Pacific finished with 208 yards of offense, including 12 rushing and 196 passing. **Oliver Petty** had a team-high 13 yards rushing on seven attempts while **Chris Brown** had 11 carries for minus five yards rushing. Quarterback **John van den Raadt** was 16-of-30 passing for 196 yards while **Matt Davis** caught seven passes for 132 yards.

San Diego totaled 291 yards on offense, including 190 rushing and 101 passing.

The teams combined to go six-of-25 on third-down, including Azusa Pacific finishing two-of-13. **Jay York** led the Cougars' defense with 11 tackles while **Greg Neale** recorded two quarterback sacks.

Azusa Pacific opened its 2009 season with a 35-13 loss at NAIA second-ranked Carroll College (Mont.) Aug. 29.

The Cougars are averaging 12.5 points and 236.5 yards of offense per game. The team averages 56.0 yards rushing and 180.5 passing while converting five-of-26 (19.2%) third-down attempts.

Brown leads the team with 91 yards rushing while van den Raadt is 23-of-54 passing for 361 yards with two touchdowns. Davis has 10 catches for 276 yards and two touchdowns through the first two games of the season.

York has a team-high 28 tackles, including 12 solo. Neale has two quarterback sacks. The team has forced three turnovers (one interception, two fumbles).

WHEN AT HALF: UW-L is 1-0 this season when trailing at the half. The Eagles trailed 6-0 at halftime in a 28-13 victory at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. UW-L was 3-2 last season when leading at the half and 0-5 when trailing.

ROAD RECORD: UW-L is 1-0 on the road in 2009 after its 28-13 win at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. The Eagles finished 1-5 on the road last season after finishing 2-2 in 2007. The Eagles are 26-25 (.510) on the road under head coach **Larry Terry**.

SCORING FIRST: UW-L is 30-7 (.811) since 2003 when scoring first and 42-13 overall (.792) under head coach **Larry Terry**. The Eagles are 10-16 (.385) since 2003 and 16-23 (.410) overall under Terry when the opponent scores first.

POINTS SCORED: UW-L is 57-17 (.770) under head coach Larry Terry when scoring at least 20 points in a game, including 1-0 this year. The Eagles were 3-2 last year when finishing with at least 20 points in a game.

The Eagles have scored 49 points the last two seasons against UW-River Falls, winning 49-34 November 3, 2007 and 49-19 November 8, 2008. The 49 points against the Falcons in 2007 were the most for UW-L since a 52-13 victory over Concordia University (Wis.) in the first round of the NCAA Division III Playoffs in 2003.

POINTS PER GAME: After averaging 20.3 points per game last season, UW-L scored 28 points in its victory (28-13) at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5.

With their 31-0 loss at UW-Whitewater October 4, 2008, the Eagles were shutout for the first time since a 41-0 loss to the University of Northern Iowa during the 1983 season. The Eagles hadn't been shutout in 283 games.

The Eagles averaged 32.2 points per game in 2007 and 28.3 points per game in 2006.

UW-L scored a season-high 49 points last year in its victory (49-19) over UW-River Falls November 8. The team has scored at least 25 points in 49 of their last 80 games dating back to the 2001 season.

SPREADING THE WEALTH: Six different players caught a pass in UW-L's 28-13 victory at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. Senior **Dan Sellers** caught five passes for 71 yards and a touchdown while sophomore **Alex Maxinoski** had four receptions for 50 yards. Junior **Jacob Boegel** finished with three catches for 60 yards while juniors **Ben Stururomski** (11 yards) and **Kyle Steffen** (five yards) along with sophomore **Lee Lauters** (minus one yard) each had one reception.

Eleven different players caught a pass last season for UW-L and four of the top-five return in 2009, including junior **Travis Bordeau** who finished with a team-high 34 catches for 491 yards. Bordeau, Steffen and senior **Tyler Keeney** each had two touchdown catches in 2008. Steffen had 23 catches for 260 yards while Keeney had 20 receptions for 297 yards. Bordeau and Keeney did not play at East Texas Baptist Sept. 5 due to injuries.

ANKER: Junior quarterback **Nick Anker** finished 15-of-30 for 196 yards and one touchdown in UW-L's 28-13 victory at East Texas Baptist College Sept. 5. He threw a 43-yard touchdown pass to Dan Sellers in the third quarter.

Anker started six games in 2008, including his first career start versus UW-Eau Claire. He finished 11-of-33 for 192 yards against the Blugolds with a career-high three touchdowns. Anker also had one interception.

He had a career-high 242 yards passing versus UW-Platteville in 2008, finishing 18-of-21. Anker also rushed for two touchdowns against the Pioneers.

RUSHING YARDS: UW-L rushed for a 163 yards on 45 attempts in its 28-13 victory at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. The Eagles averaged 3.6 yards per attempt and recorded three rushing touchdowns.

UW-L averaged 133.7 yards per game rushing in 2008. The Eagles had a season-high 388 yards rushing in a 49-19 victory over UW-River Falls November 8. UW-L also had a season-high five rushing touchdowns. The team had a season-low minus seven yards in a 21-7 loss at UW-Stevens Point November 15. The Pointers had six sacks in the game.

UW-L averaged 3.9 yards per attempt last season after averaging 5.6 in 2007. The Eagles averaged 182.1 rushing yards per game in 2007.

100-YARD GAME: The Eagles are 22-8 (.733) since 2003 when a player rushes for at least 100 yards in a game. Senior tailback **Reid Oldenburg** had a career-high 139 yards rushing in UW-L's 28-13 victory at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5.

OLDENBURG: Senior tailback **Reid Oldenburg** set career-highs in rushing attempts (24) and yards (139) in UW-L's 28-13 victory at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. He averaged 5.8 yards per attempt and scored on runs of 48-yards in the third quarter and three-yards in the fourth. The two rushing touchdowns tied a career-high for Oldenburg.

He had 107 rushing yards and two touchdowns versus UW-River Falls Nov. 8, 2008 and 85 yards rushing and two scores at UW-Stout Nov. 1, 2008.

Oldenburg is UW-L's top returning rusher in 2009 after finishing with 65 carries for 382 yards and six touchdowns in a year ago. He also returned 20 kickoffs for 525 yards in 2008. Oldenburg returned two punts for 11 yards at East Texas Baptist.

LAUTERS: Sophomore tailback **Lee Lauters** had 10 carries for 46 yards in the Eagles' 28-13 victory at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. He averaged 4.6 yards per carry. Lauters also had one kickoff return for 23 yards against the Tigers.

TOTAL OFFENSE: UW-L totaled 359 yards of offense in its 28-13 win at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5, finishing with 163 yards rushing and 196 passing. The Eagles averaged 295.8 yards of offense last season (133.7 rushing; 162.1 passing). The Eagles had with a season-high 538 yards in their 49-19 victory over UW-River Falls Nov. 8, 2008, totaling 388 yards rushing (season-high) and 150 passing. The 295.8 yards per game is the lowest for a UW-L team since finishing with 284.8 in 1983.

UW-L had a season-low 120 yards (minus seven rushing; 127 passing) in a 21-7 loss at UW-Stevens Point November 15.

The Eagles averaged 435.9 yards of offense in 2007, including 182.1 rushing and 253.8 passing. UW-L finished with at least 400 yards of offense in six of nine contests.

UW-L set a single-season school record with 5,282 total yards of offense in 2003.

DID YOU KNOW?: UW-L is 50-15 (.769) overall under head coach **Larry Terry** when the team has more rushing attempts than passing attempts.

POINTS BY PERIOD: The Eagles were outscored 6-0 in the second quarter in their 28-13 win at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. UW-L outscored ETBU 14-7 in the third period and 14-0 in the fourth. Neither team scored in the first quarter.

UW-L was outscored in three of four quarters last season, including 52-33 in the first; 71-67 in the second and 53-52 in the third. The Eagles and their opponents each tallied 51 points in the fourth period.

TURNOVER MARGIN: UW-L was plus three in turnover margin in its 28-13 win at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. The Eagles picked off three Tigers' passes and recovered one fumble while losing one fumble themselves.

UW-L finished minus four in turnover margin in 2008. The Eagles recovered five fumbles and recorded 12 interceptions. UW-L lost 10 fumbles and threw 11 interceptions.

The team finished +3 in turnover margin in 2007 and has forced a turnover in 62 of the last 72 contests.

OVERTIME HISTORY: With its 27-20 overtime victory over Azusa Pacific September 15, 2007, UW-L is 5-5 all-time in overtime games. The Eagles last overtime contest prior to their win over Azusa Pacific was a 27-20 double overtime loss at UW-Eau Claire in 2005. UW-L played two overtime games in 2002, defeating UW-Platteville 35-28 at home while falling 23-20 at UW-Whitewater.

INTERCEPTIONS: UW-L picked off three passes in its 28-13 victory at East Texas Baptist University. Junior cornerback **Derek Dreher**, who had a team-high four interceptions last season, finished with two interceptions against the Tigers. He now has eight career interceptions.

Senior linebacker **Blake Roemer** picked up his first career interception at ETBU Sept. 5.

The Eagles recorded nine interceptions in their last five games of the 2008 campaign, including three in a 49-19 victory over UW-River Falls

Nov. 8.

Senior cornerback **Matt Winney** had three interceptions last season while junior **Billy Niggeman** recorded two. Seniors defensive end **Jonathan Flancher** and senior cornerback **Eric Odden** along with junior strong safety **Dustin Drath** each had one interception in 2008. Flancher returned his interception seven yards for a touchdown against UW-River Falls.

MORE INTERCEPTIONS: UW-L has recorded one interception in 50 in its last 68 games overall. The Eagles are 49-22 (.690) under **Larry Terry** when intercepting a pass. The school record of 29 interceptions was set in 1980 and 1982.

SECONDARY: Junior strong safety **Dustin Drath** tied for the team lead with six tackles (all unassisted) in UW-L's 28-13 win at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. Senior linebacker **Aaron Johnson** and senior defensive end **Derek Jones** also had six tackles.

Drath was second on the team with 69 tackles last season, including 31 solo. He had a team-high nine tackles in UW-L's 35-21 loss to UW-Eau Claire October 11. Drath also had a fumble recovery against the Blugolds. He finished with a team-high 12 tackles in the Eagles' 26-14 loss at UW-Stout November 1. Drath tied for the team lead with eight tackles in a 35-7 win at UW-Oshkosh October 25 and also recorded an interception and two pass break-ups. He finished tied for third on the team with four pass break-ups.

Junior cornerback **Billy Niggeman** was fourth in tackles last season with 50, including a season-high 10 at UW-Stevens Point November 15. He was also third on the team with two interceptions. Senior cornerback **Matt Winney** recorded 41 tackles, three interceptions and five pass break-ups in 2008. He ranked fifth on the team in tackles and second in interceptions and pass break-ups.

Senior cornerback **Derek Dreher** had a team-high four interceptions and six pass break-ups. He was seventh in tackles with 36.

JOHNSON: Senior linebacker **Aaron Johnson** tied junior strong safety **Dustin Drath** and senior defensive end **Derek Jones** for the team lead with six tackles in the Eagles' 28-13 win at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5.

Johnson returns after finishing second on the team in tackles in 2008 with 76, including 34 solo. He was tied for second in tackles for loss (7.0) and quarterback sacks (4.0) last season.

Johnson had a season-high 11 tackles at UW-Stout November 1 and UW-Stevens Point November 15. He finished with 10 tackles at Azusa Pacific University September 20. Johnson also had one forced and one recovered fumble in 2008.

JONES: Senior defensive end **Derek Jones** tied for the team lead with six tackles in a 28-13 win at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. He also had a team-high 3.0 tackles for loss and tied for the team lead with 1.5 quarterback sacks with senior linebacker **Blake Roemer**. Jones also forced a Tigers' fumble.

SACKS: UW-L recorded three quarterback sacks in its season-opening 28-13 win at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. Senior defensive end **Derek Jones** and senior linebacker **Blake Roemer** each had 1.5 quarterback sacks.

The Eagles finished with a season-high seven sacks in its 37-6 win over UW-Platteville Oct. 18, 2008. The seven sacks were the most for the Eagles since totaling six against UW-Stevens Point October 21, 2000. Senior linebacker **Blake Roemer** had three sacks against UW-Platteville.

The Eagles had 16 sacks in 2008 after recording 17 in 2007. Linebacker **Drew Kiefer** has a team-high 4.5 sacks last season while senior linebacker **Aaron Johnson** and Roemer were tied for second with 4.0.

THIRD-DOWN: The Eagles were seven-of-19 (36.8%) on third-down in their 28-13 win at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. UW-L was 49-of-135 (36.3%) on third-down last year and 47-of-131 (35.9%) in 2007.

OPPONENTS: East Texas Baptist University was five-of-14 (35.7%) on third-down in UW-L's 28-13 win Sept. 5. Opponents finished 66-of-154 (42.9%) on third-down last season against UW-L.

FOURTH-DOWN: After finishing four-of-17 (23.5%) on fourth-down attempts last year, UW-L was three-of-four (75.0%) in its 28-13 win at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. The Eagles were 15-of-26 (57.7%) on fourth-down in 2007.

ETBU missed on its only fourth-down attempt Sept. 5. Opponents were 11-of-18 (61.1%) on fourth-down last year.

RED-ZONE: UW-L was two-of-four (50.0%) in red-zone opportunities in its 28-13 victory at East Texas Baptist University. The Eagles had two rushing touchdowns while missing two field goals. UW-L finished 20-of-31 (64.5%) in red-zone chances last year with 17 touchdowns and three field goals. The team was 14-of-18 in the red-zone in its last five games (12 touchdowns, two field goals).

UW-L finished 33-of-47 (70.2%) in red-zone opportunities in 2007. The Eagles had 30 touchdowns (17 rushing; 13 passing) in the red-zone and were three-of-eight on field goal attempts.

OPPONENTS' RED-ZONE: East Texas Baptist University did not have a red-zone opportunity in UW-L's 28-13 victory Sept. 5. Opponents were 28-of-34 (82.4%) in red-zone chances last year with 22 touchdowns and six field goals.

Opponents were 32-of-40 (80.0%) in red-zone chances versus UW-L in 2007. They finished with 24 touchdowns (16 rushing; eight passing) and were eight-of-11 in field goal attempts.

DEFENSE: UW-L allowed 200 yards of offense (80 rushing; 120 passing) in its 28-13 win at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. The Eagles averaged 338.6 yards of offense last season, including a season-high 500 (287 rushing, 213 passing) at the University of North Dakota September 13. UW-Stout recorded an opponent season-high 303 rushing yards against UW-L November 1 while UW-Eau Claire had a season-high 307 passing yards October 11.

Opponents averaged 146.6 rushing and 192.0 passing yards per game last year. The Eagles allowed 361.3 yards of offense per game in 2007, including 159.3 rushing and 202.0 passing.

After allowing 25.6 points in 2007, opponents averaged 22.7 in 2008. UW-L held ETBU to 13 points Sept. 5.

PENALTIES: UW-L had 10 penalties for 99 yards in its 28-13 victory over East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. The Eagles had 53 penalties for 474 yards last season, an average of 47.4 yards per game. UW-L finished with 60 penalties for 532 yards (59.1 yards per game) in 2007.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Junior **Dylan Rude** was four-of-four in extra-point attempts in UW-L's 28-13 win at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5, but he missed two field goal attempts. Rude missed a 28-yard attempt in the second quarter and his 38-yard field goal was blocked in the fourth quarter.

Rude was 16-of-20 on extra-point attempts and one-of-six in field goals in 2007. He converted all 24 of his extra-point attempts and finished three-of-four in field goals in 2006.

For his career, Rude is now 44-of-48 in extra-point attempts and four-of-12 in field goal attempts.

PUNTING: Freshman **Christian Hallingstad** averaged 37.8 yards on six punts in UW-L's 28-13 win at East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. He had a long of 47 yards and finished with one punt inside the 20-yard line.

RETURNS: Freshman tailback **Tyler O'Kane** returned two kickoffs for 28 yards with a long of 18 in the Eagles' 28-13 win over East Texas Baptist University Sept. 5. He also returned one punt for two yards. Sophomore tailback **Lee Lauters**, who finished with three kickoff returns for 89 yards (29.7 average) in 2008, returned one kickoff for 23 yards at ETBU.

Senior **Reid Oldenburg** had two punt returns for 11 yards at East Texas Baptist. He led UW-L with 20 kickoff returns for 525 yards (26.2 average) last season with a long of 59 yards.

SCHOOL RECORDS: UW-L finished with 1,018 kickoff return yards in 2008, second-most in single-season school history. The Eagles averaged 21.7 yards per return.

UW-L had a school record 1,040 kickoff return yards in 2007. The Eagles also set a single-game school record with 251 kickoff return yards at UW-River Falls November 3, 2007. UW-L averaged 26.0 yards on 40 kickoff returns in 2007.
