Dual Degree

1. Students cannot formally be admitted into the program until they have completed 75 credits. Thus, admissions may have to wait until after a semester to ensure these credits are completed.
2. Students who are enrolled in a Dual Degree program are not allowed to enroll in more than 15 credits per semester.
3. Students must take RTH 592 the last semester they are on campus before internship.
4. Students must purchase textbooks for graduate courses in which they enroll.
