Best Buy offers many options for Tech Recycling. There is a \$10.00 fee for recycling of acceptable products, but they replace that fee with a \$10.00 **Best Buy gift card** (which can be recycled after use at one of their recycling kiosks in Best Buy store entrances!)

From **TV's** to **DVD players**, they accept two items per household per day.

Other recyclables such as **inkjet cartridges**, **CDs/DVDs**, and **batteries** are also accepted in the store entrance recycling kiosk and this is free of charge!

Their Tech Box Recycling service costs just \$5, \$10, or \$15 per box, including shipping, handling, and recycling. All boxes are made using 100% recycled cardboard.**

Office Depot accepts CRT and LCD **computer monitors** that are not cracked or leaking. Also accepted are **televisions** (less than 32"), **cameras**, **cords**, **telephones**, and many other electronics!*

They also recycle **NiCad batteries** and **rechargeable batteries**.* It is important to properly dispose of these since they contain cadmium, a toxic heavy metal!**
