"The DLA was voted by my peers as the best leader in the class. This meant a lot to me, and a lot of the credit goes to EBAR for helping me become the leader I am today. I know I still have so much more to learn and I am extremely excited for what's to come."

He went on to thank Eagle Battalion: "EBAR set me up tremendously for success. Take notes and learn from all of the Cadre there. Use them as your mentors as you go throughout your career. The Cadre at EBAR have done a lot in the Army and know the rights versus wrongs. Again, take advantage of the training you get. The more you put into the program the more you will get from it and it will only benefit you in the end. Get involved and stay involved, not only with ROTC but also focus on your schooling. "

On the topic of BOLC 2LT said: "Go into BOLC with an expectation to learn and to work hard. Also come in confident in yourself, but know you have so much more to learn. You're gonna meet some amazing people, there's gonna be hard times and challenges but you're gonna push through them and there's going to be fun times. Don't be afraid to make mistakes. In fact BOLC is the time to make mistakes and learn from them. Take advantage of the training and do everything you can to learn and soak in as much as possible. The three things that led me to success was 1. be on time 2. be in the right uniform 3. show up ready to engage and learn."

He concluded with giving cadets one last piece of advice: "Don't do it for the credit and acknowledgement, do it because you care and the credit will come naturally."
