Foreign Study Credit for the French Major

A student pursuing a major in French at the University of Wisconsin - La Crosse, may earn up to 66% of the credit hours for the major requirement in a foreign country. Thirty-four per cent of the credit hours must be earned at UW-L. The student is required to take at least one course in French after returning from the country of study.

A student has the right to petition this policy. In this event, the Chair of the Department of Modern Languages shall appoint a committee to evaluate the case in terms of the following criteria:

- Proficiency examinations (oral and written).
- Evaluation of the student's performance prior to the study experience in the foreign country.

The Committee shall submit its findings to the Department Chair who will in turn report to the student concerned.
