A. Required courses in German

- Complete four additional upper-level courses in German (12 credits)

B. Two approved courses in the art, business, history, literature, politics, music, religion, sociology and other disciplines in which a significant portion of the course relates to one or more countries in the German-speaking world. These courses may be taught in German or English. *The department's course on German Literature in Translation (GER 399) and Foreign Literature in Translation (MLG 299) are strongly recommended.*

German 399 is German Literature in Translation. This is a new course that also fulfills the literature course in the Humanistic Studies section of the General Education Program. In the course students read translations of the works originally written in German.

MLG 299 is Foreign Literature in Translation. This, too, fulfills the literature course requirement in the Humanistic Studies section of the General Education Program. In this course students read translations from the various language areas taught in the Department of Modern Languages.
