Enrique Morones, an Immigration activist, is president of *Border Angels*, a humanitarian relief organization he founded in 1986, which places food, water, and other provisions in the desert on the U.S.-Mexico border, with the goal of saving migrant lives. He also founded *Gente Unida*, a human rights border coalition of 65 groups, formed in response to the xenophobic, anti-immigrant group “Minutemen.” He has received many awards and recognitions, and is listed as one of the 100 most influential Latinos in the U.S. by *Hispanic Business Magazine*.
