Brainstorm #1

Which one of your courses appears to be a good spot to try a CAT?

Which lesson or topic in that course would you like to investigate via a CAT? (i.e. are there any concepts your students seem to struggle with, any needs for data on a new pedagogy you are trying?)

Brainstorm #2

Based on your ideas from Brainstorm #1, plan out a possible use of a CAT (whether one we have seen or one you create).

Some other issues to consider:

- **When you would make use of this strategy? (i.e. at beginning, middle, end a class session)**
- **Would you review immediately in class? Review and bring back to the next class?**
- **Do you think you would just review or try to do a quick feedback (+, √, or -) on each item to return to students?**
