### REGISTER FOR THE WISCONSIN PLACEMENT TESTS (Information Enclosed)

The Wisconsin Placement Tests are required of all students planning to attend UWL. Please carefully read the enclosed information and register for your test date as soon as possible. Students are strongly encouraged to take the exam before START so that your scores are available when you register for classes.

### PAY YOUR DEPOSITS FOR FALL 2019

We hope that you are enjoying your senior year ... it's going by quickly and we are already looking forward to seeing you in June! If you have not already done so, you need to make your \$100 enrollment deposit, complete the on-campus housing application and pay the \$150 housing deposit.

You should submit the enrollment deposit using your WINGS Student Center (see the checklist that was included with your admission letter). After your enrollment deposit is received, you will be mailed on-campus housing information and instructions. Please follow the instructions, complete the contract and pay the deposit

Only students who have submitted the enrollment deposit will be sent START materials in the spring. Both deposits are refundable until May 1, 2019.





We can only accommodate a specific number of students for each date in order to provide adequate advising for all students.



## Get A Head Start ON YOUR COLLEGE EXPERIENCE

#### FASTTRACK:

FastTrack is a summer mathematics enhancement program where incoming freshmen develop their mathematical skills online for six weeks before meeting on campus for a oneweek campus stay. The goal of the program is for students placed into MTH 050 or 051 to increase their skills in order to place into a higher mathematics class. ### FIRST FLIGHT:

First Flight is a great option to consider as you start your college experience. You will engage in adventure education and be placed in unique situations with other incoming freshmen. Each program will run for six days. Depending on which trip you select, three or four nights are spent climbing, backpacking or kayaking. ### COLLEGE CREDIT TRANSFER

Future UW-La Crosse students can earn college credit in high school through a number of programs.

- 1. Advanced Placement (AP): Students earning a score of "3" or higher on the AP Exams are eligible for credit.
- 2. International Baccalaureate (IB): Students earning
- a "4" or higher on IB-Higher Level exams are eligible for credit. 3. College Level Examination Program (CLEP) credits are also available.

Students can also earn college credit from a college or university during high school. All final college transcripts must be sent to the Admissions Office prior to the student's first day of class. If transcripts are not received, students will not be eligible to register for their second semester of classes.

### STUDENT HEALTH CENTER

The UWL Student Health Center (SHC) is a comprehensive outpatient clinic promoting good health, emphasizing patient education and encouraging preventive care to help ensure academic success for all students

Services available include primary care, mental health, minor injuries, x-ray, lab, immunizations, female and male reproductive care (including STI testing and contraception), allergy shots and physical therapy.

The SHC staff includes board-certified physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, physical therapists, nurses, medical technologists, medical assistants and office personnel who are experienced in working with the health care needs of college students.

### HOUSING APPLICATION

The housing contract and application process gives you the opportunity to provide information that will shape your on-campus experience. You are encouraged to complete the housing application as soon as possible. If you would like to change your preferences or update information, you can return to the housing application after initially completing it.

- Select or change your top three hall assignment preferences.
- Pick a meal plan.
- Create a roommate profile.

After you have completed the housing application, you will be able to access the Roommate Group process. This process allows you to connect with other UWL students who have completed the housing application. Once you have found your roommate, you can form a roommate group, which will allow you to be assigned to a room together for the 2019-20 academic year.

- Selecting a roommate is optional. If you do not select a roommate you will be assigned one.
- Review recommended roommates for you based upon preferences provided in the housing application.
- Search for roommates based on responses to specific profile questions.
- Do you know who you want to live with? You can also search for roommates by first and last name.

# IMPORTANT IT INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS

Microsoft Office 365 offers core productivity tools for the campus. Students are allowed, at no cost, to install Office on up to five personal devices.

ITS works diligently to keep students, faculty and staff safe, informed, and secure in the data environment. Be careful when clicking on links, especially on smartphones. If you are not certain of the validity of an email or web link, do not click on it. On your computer, simply hovering your mouse over the FROM: field will reveal if the message is coming from a valid source. Finally, make sure your virus protection software is up

### To protect yourself from phishing attacks, malware, viruses and ransomware, following these steps:

- 1. ITS will never ask for your password or verify your account through email.
- 2. If you're not sure if an email is a phishing attack or a valid message, don't click
- 3. Be sure to read UWL ITS emails, especially when the subject line says ITS Alert or Attack. Ensure important ITS or university emails are not automatically going into your Junk or Clutter folders.
- 4. If you inadvertently clicked on a phishing email and provided your user name and password, reset them immediately. You can do this by going to the Password Reset Management web page: https://www.uwlax.edu/info/password-reset
- 5. Check the ITS Facebook page for phishing attacks, alerts and general technology

# PARKING ON CAMPUS

Parking in any of the university lots requires a purchasing a parking permit.

Campus parking sells permits based on seniority. The Parking Office strongly discourages incoming freshmen from bringing cars to campus. There may be a limited number of resident parking permits available for purchase.

All students living on campus will learn about the online procedures for purchasing a parking permit at START this summer. Parking permits for students living on campus are \$166 per semester and \$240 for two semesters.

Commuter parking permits for new freshmen living off campus will be sold on a first come, first serve basis this summer. Information will be available at START. Parking permits for students living off campus are \$135 per semester and \$190 for two semesters.





### U-PASS BUS SYSTEM

The U-Pass provides

unlimited bus service on any current La Crosse

Municipal Transit Utility (MTU) route in La Crosse or Onalaska for no cost when students show their UWL student ID.

The U-Pass/Safety Bus also has no cost. It runs from 10 p.m. to 3 a.m. Thursdays, and from 9 p.m. to 3 a.m. Fridays and Saturdays. The Safety Bus runs between on- and off-campus housing areas and downtown La Crosse every 15 minutes.

### **SMRT BUS (REGIONAL BUS SERVICE)**

This transit bus service makes various trips around the greater La Crosse area.
