UW-La Crosse Checklist: After You Submit Deposits and Housing Application

- Apply for financial aid (Oct. 1–Feb. 1): www.fafsa.ed.gov. UWL's priority date is February 1, 2019.
- Apply for UWL Foundation Scholarships by February 1, 2019. uwlax.academicworks.com
- Sign up for a UW System Placement Test. Information about signing up will be sent in early February.
- Minnesota students apply for tuition reciprocity beginning March 1. https://www.ohe.state.mn.us/ssl/reciprocity/apply1.cfm Contact the Minnesota Higher Education Services Office at 800.657.3866 if you have questions.
- Information regarding START will be sent via mail to all admitted students who have paid the \$100 enrollment deposit. Watch for this packet in April and then sign up for START!
- After graduation, contact your high school to have them send an official final transcript to the UWL Admissions Office. Request any official college transcripts for courses you took.
- Send AP scores to UW-La Crosse at www.collegeboard.com.
- Watch for New Student Orientation and Welcome Week information sent in August.
- MOVE IN! A variety of Welcome Weekend events, including residence hall move-in day and new student orientation, take place over the Labor Day weekend. Classes begin Tuesday, September 3, 2019.



I'M ADMITTED TO UWL ... NOW WHAT DO I DO?

To-do list.

- PAY YOUR DEPOSITS. Housing is assigned on a first-come, first-served basis, and you cannot apply for housing without first paying your \$100 enrollment deposit and then \$150 housing deposit.
- Apply for scholarships through UWL Foundation. For a listing of available scholarships and application information, visit uwlax.academicworks.com. Applications are due February 1, 2019.
- Take the University of Wisconsin System placement tests in English and math. Foreign language placement is also available. MOST TESTS ARE OFFERED SATURDAYS IN MARCH AND APRIL. All Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, Illinois and Michigan students are strongly encouraged to attend a spring test date. Information about registering for the test and test locations will be sent in early February.
- Make sure we have your highest ACT or SAT test score. This score combined with your UW System placement test scores will determine your placement into English and math courses your freshman year. Request your score online at www.actstudent.org or www.collegeboard.com.
- Visit campus one more time! Log onto www.uwlax.edu/visit to plan your day. Tours are available at 11 a.m. and 2:15 p.m., Monday through Friday (except during winter break). Two Campus Close-Up open house events are scheduled for the spring on February 15, 2019 and April 26, 2019.

ON-CAMPUS HOUSING

Did you apply for housing? If not, and you are planning to live in the residence halls, act NOW to reserve your space! On-campus housing is limited and assignments are made based on the date you complete the online housing contract and submit the \$150 housing deposit.



STEPS TO APPLYING FOR HOUSING:

- Submit \$100 enrollment deposit using your WINGS Student Center.
- 2. Complete the online housing application and pay \$150 housing deposit. For step-by-step instructions and a link to the housing application, visit www.uwlax.edu/reslife/apply-for-housing/application-process
- 3. You may log back in to update any selections you have made.
- *The housing application will become available 24-48 hours after the enrollment deposit is processed.

WHAT RESIDENCE HALL SHOULD I CHOOSE?

HOW DO I FIND A ROOMMATE?

Completing the housing contract and application not only guarantees you on-campus housing, but also provides you with opportunities to find a roommate. The application contains a questionnaire that will create a profile for you based on your living habits. The roommate group process is separate from the application and will only be available once your application is completed.

WHAT'S IN MY ROOM?

Each room contains a desk, chair, bed and dresser for each resident. All rooms have a refrigerator, cable and Internet access. Residence hall mattresses are 33" x 79". Extra-long twin fitted sheets are necessary and are available at many stores.
