



STUDENT PARKING PERMIT REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

**Parking permits are sold based on earned credit hours.
Availability is not guaranteed and lots sell out.**

- Second Week of July — Graduates, Seniors
- Third Week of July — Juniors
- Fourth Week of July — Sophomores
- Fifth Week of July — Freshmen



Follow these steps to purchase a permit:

- Ensure you have access to UWL email and a valid NetID. Check email regularly for an announcement that permits are available for sale.
- Determine if you will live on or off campus. On-campus (resident) students should purchase a resident permit. Off-campus (commuter) students should purchase a commuter permit. Commuter permits are not valid for overnight parking on campus.

- Download a campus map from the website to determine which lot best meets your needs. Note locations of resident and commuter lots.
- Select Purchase a Permit.
- Select Annual/Semesterly.
- Enter your NetID and password.
- Read the instructions carefully and purchase the permit. You may pay in full or by student bill. Student bill is the best option to avoid credit card transaction fees.

LICENSE PLATE RECOGNITION YOUR PLATE IS YOUR PERMIT



UWL uses vehicle license plates as permits to park on campus. Enforcement officers scan license plates with vehicle-mounted cameras.

- Follow the instructions on this sheet to purchase a permit. Ensure your vehicle and license plate are accurate when you purchase your permit.
- Students may initially register one vehicle upon purchase of a permit.
- Additional vehicles may be added if they belong to family members. Students may not add any other vehicles to their accounts.
- Students are not authorized to purchase multiple permits or have more than one vehicle on campus.
- Vehicles with only one license plate are prohibited from backing in or pulling through parking spaces.

Vehicle and owner information is not shared with any other agencies, per the Driver's Privacy Protection Act and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. Vehicle information is only used to confirm rights and compliance with parking regulations.
