2. Revisions to the global context of business rubric

Nicole Gullekson and Nilakshi Borah, members of the International Business Advisory Committee (IBAC), joined us for today's meeting to discuss revisions to the CBA global context of business rubric. The Task Force feels that it does not have the expertise needed to determine the appropriate rubric traits or performance descriptions and because of this asked IBAC to collaborate with us on revising the rubric.

One of the main points of discussion centered around the global knowledge and skills that we want all CBA students to have upon graduation. Historically, the core curriculum and the CBA global rubric have focused on global knowledge as opposed to intercultural competency skills. The International Business major encompasses both of these areas.

IBAC will put together a draft of a new global rubric by the end of February so that it can be piloted in MGT 449 in the spring semester. Following this, the revised rubric will be brought to the faculty to ensure that the traits and performance descriptions reflect a consensus of the global knowledge and skills that our majors should have when they graduate. Upon adoption of the revised rubric, the core curriculum should be examined to ensure that student learning with respect to the global learning objective is appropriately scaffolded throughout the program.

The next meeting is November 5, 2018, where we will review the CITM reports.
