

Doctor Paul S. Mueller is the regional vice president of the Mayo Clinic Health System, Southwest Wisconsin. He is a professor of medicine and professor of biomedical ethics in Mayo Clinic College of Medicine and Science.

Doctor Mueller earned his B.A. at Augsburg College in Minneapolis, Minnesota, and his M.D. and Master of Public Health degrees at the Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore. He completed his internship, residency and chief residency in internal medicine at the Johns Hopkins Hospital.

Doctor Mueller's clinical practice encompasses outpatient primary care and consultative general internal medicine. He has been recognized as a "Top Internist" by *U.S. News & World Report*. He has received numerous recognitions for teaching excellence.

Doctor Mueller's research focus is biomedical ethics, especially ethical dilemmas associated with life-prolonging technologies such as implantable cardiac devices. He has authored or co-authored hundreds of peer-reviewed articles, book chapters, abstracts, letters and columns. He is an associate editor for *NEJM Journal Watch General Medicine*. Recognizing his accomplishments, the Lloyd A. and Barbara A. Amundson Professorship in Biomedical Ethics Honoring Paul S. Mueller, M.D. was established at Mayo Clinic in 2018.

Doctor Mueller is a fellow of the American College of Physicians (ACP) and the recipient of the ACP's prestigious Laureate Award. He served on the Board of Regents (including as board chair) of Augsburg University and currently is the national chair of Augsburg's Endowment Campaign. He also is a member of the Viterbo University Board of Trustees.
