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## Additional Testing/Portfolio Requirements for SPE Program Completion

- Admission to Teacher Admission to the MC-EA Teacher Education Program (TEP): Application Requirements for the Department of Educational Studies MC-EA Program can be found <u>HERE.</u>
- Admission to Special Education (SPE) Program: Applicants must be admitted to a teacher education program **BEFORE** being admitted to the SPE Program. Applicants may apply to their program and SPE minor in the same semester. Applications Requirements for the Special Education Program can be found HERE.
- <u>Declare emphasis area (ID, EBD, or SLD)</u>: This is changeable; see the Special Education Program Coordinator.
- <u>Foundations of Reading Test</u>: A minimum score of **240** on the Wisconsin Foundations of Reading Test must be on file in with the School of Education *before* the student teaching semester begins. Register to test at <a href="http://www.wi.nesinc.com/">http://www.wi.nesinc.com/</a>. Teacher candidates are encouraged to take the FoRT test immediately after completion of the Field I block.
- <u>Content competency demonstrated</u>: teacher candidates must have demonstrated content knowledge prior to the student teaching semester using one of the following options.:
  - o *MC-EA major:* 3.0 GPA in Special Education minor, or received a passing score (146 or higher) on the Praxis II Middle School Content Test (5146).
  - o *EA-A major:* 3.0 GPA in Special Education minor, or received a passing score (146 or higher) on the Praxis II Middle School Content Test (5146).
- <u>Teacher Education Portfolio</u>: Candidates must complete two (2) portfolio benchmark assessments to complete their program. The Pre-student Teaching Benchmark occurs during the Field in Special Education. The Post-student Teaching Benchmark occurs during the student teaching semester.
