Additional Testing/Portfolio Requirements for SPE Program Completion

- 1. Admission to Teacher Education Program (TEP) in MC-EA or EA-A developmental range.
- 2. Admission to the Special Education (SPE) Program: Candidates must be admitted to a teacher education major program in order to be admitted into the degree-seeking special education minor. However, candidates may apply for admission to the minor in the same semester as application to the major program. Admission requirements can be found at: https://www.uwlax.edu/Educational-Studies/SPE-minor-admission/
- 3. <u>Declared emphasis area</u> (CD, EBD, or SLD). Emphasis area can be changed after consultation with the Special Education Program Director.
- 4. <u>Foundations of Reading Test</u>: A minimum score of **240** on the Wisconsin Foundations of Reading Test must be on file in 260 Morris Hall BEFORE the first student teaching semester begins. Register to test at http://www.wi.nesinc.com/. Teacher candidates are encouraged to take the FoRT test immediately after completion of the Field I course(s).
- 5. Praxis II Subject Assessment test #5146 Middle School Content Knowledge: Test should be taken after admission to teacher education. A minimum score of **146** must be on file in 260 Morris Hall BEFORE the first student teaching semester begins. Register to test at www.ets.org/praxis. Teacher candidates are encouraged to take the Praxis II test before the Field II course(s).
- 6. Teacher Education Portfolio: Candidates must complete two (2) portfolio benchmark assessments to complete their program. The Pre-student Teaching Benchmark occurs during the Field II semester associated with the major program. ("UG Special" certification add-on candidates complete the Pre-student Teaching Benchmark during the semester in which SPE 446 or 447 is completed). The Post-Student Teaching Benchmark occurs during the major (first) student teaching semester. Note: Teacher candidates show attainment of standards in the SPE Student Teaching semester, but do not complete an additional portfolio.
