

International Studies Checklist

The International Studies (INS) program at UWL is designed to provide you with a quality interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary education that encourages you to think beyond boundaries and examine a broad array of cultural, economic, environmental, geographic, historical, natural, political and social interactions and relationships that shape our world.

The recently revised INS program requires courses totaling **18 credits**, however, it is important to keep in mind that **a maximum of 6 credits may overlap with General Education, your major, and/or your minor**. Indeed, you are strongly encouraged to think about this minor as a way to explore the interactions and relationships the shape our world from perspectives that differ from your major or minor.

**The “Language Requirement” is no long a formal requirement in any of the revised INS minors and, therefore, the INS Director is willing to consider requests to waive the requirement if it still shows up in your Advisement Report in WINGS, and assuming that you still have at least 18 other credits that could count towards your INS minor.
