





WINGS



WINGS is the UWL student information system. The software provides UWL students, faculty and staff with access to information related to recruiting and admissions, records and registration, financial, bill payments, and self-service options.

COURSE LOAD REQUIREMENTS



To receive financial aid as a graduate student, you must be registered for a minimum of 5 credits. You must be registered for 9 credits to be considered full-time. The recommended full-time load is 12 credits per semester. The maximum course load for graduate students is 15 credits per semester and 9 credits during a 12-week summer session. Please see your graduate program director for program-specific requirements.

For international students:

To maintain legal immigration status, international students must be enrolled full-time each semester for no less than 9 credits. Failure to maintain full-time status can result in the loss of F-1/J-1 student visa benefits.

REGISTERING FOR CLASSES



Before registering for classes, reach out to your program director to ensure you enroll in the right courses. Your enrollment date and time is located in your WINGS Student Center. There is a non-refundable registration fee. Some programs require students to register through their advisors instead of WINGS.

ACADEMIC STANDING AND TIME TO DEGREE




To stay in good academic standing, graduate students must maintain at least a 3.0 cumulative grade point average. Any student receiving a D or F in a graduate course will be dismissed from graduate study.

Students must complete their degree within seven years of enrollment.





STUDENT HEALTH CENTER






