Kimberly also has a background in clinical program development, leadership, and reimbursement. Kimberly currently works in home health alongside her involvement as an instructor, coach, consultant, and Founding Partner of Aspire OT. Kimberly has additional certifications such as a Certified Life Coach, Stepping On Leader, CarFit Certified Technician, and Physical Agent Modalities.. Outside the clinic, Kimberly has shown dedication to the community by serving as a former Vice-Chair for the Eastern District of the Tennessee Occupational Therapy Association and also by becoming a formerfounding member of Tennessee Falls Prevention Coalition. Kimberly Breeden was a PainWeek Scholarship Recipient and is a member of the 2017 AOTA Middle Managers Leadership Cohort and Phi Beta Epsilon Honor Society.



From starting her career in television news production, Niccole Rowe transitioned to occupational therapy and knows this profession is where she belongs. Niccole, a practicing COTA/L, has been working in the occupational therapy field for 10 years in a variety of settings including acute care, skilled nursing, outpatient therapy, and academia. Leading the way with chronic pain management, Niccole also has served as a professor, instructor, author, and advocate for occupational therapy assistants. Niccole is one of the founding partners of the occupational therapy CE company, Aspire OT and also is currently working as an adjunct professor at South College in Tennessee and as an PRN OTA in acute care. When she is not working, she serves on the ACOTE Educational Standard Review. Committee. In 2016, she was chosen for and completed AOTA's Emerging Leader Development Program. In 2020, Niccole Rowe was the recipient of the AOTA Gary Kielhofner Emerging Leader Award!

Kimberly and Niccole, together, are national leaders in occupational therapy pain management. They developed a successful outpatient occupational therapy pain program within a practice recognized as a Center of Excellence for the treatment of pain. Their collaborative partnership in the treatment of pain was recognized with the American Occupational Therapy Association's 2018 Terry Brittell OTA/OT Partnership Award. They have authored two continuing education articles for OT Practice magazine on the subject of chronic pain and opioid guidelines. Kim and Niccole were honored to serve as co-authors for AOTA's official position statement "Role of Occupational Therapy in Pain Management" published in 2021. They have also served as contributing authors to an occupational therapy textbook on the same subject of OT in the treatment of pain. They have traveled across the country serving as instructors for various courses on the subject of pain and non-pharmacological interventions for the treatment of pain. Niccole and Kim are proud to be invited to be the 2023 Distinguished Lecturers for the University of Wisconsin, La Crosse Occupational Therapy Program.
