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Artifact Show a Success!

Thanks to fifteen Midwest artifact collectors, the 2006 Artifact Show held on March 11 was quite a success. A steady flow of individuals brought in artifacts for identification, and many artifact displays were extensive and exotic. Most collections are of prehistoric artifacts recovered by collectors, with some historic artifacts on display as well. The Prairie du Chien Historical Society displayed many historic artifacts from the Fort Crawford Museum. Over 2,000 people stopped by the tables to view and discuss the artifacts on display.

The 2006 mystery artifact was a stone hoe (see image at right) which was donated to MVAC last year by the Gary Tischer family of La Crosse. Gerald Hiebich of Ettrick correctly guessed that this tool was used for hoeing corn and other crops by late prehistoric cultures. Congratulations to Mr. Hiebich, who will receive a free MVAC membership for the year.

Public Field Survey

Record attendance made this year's Public Field Survey one of the best ever! Over forty people attended this two-day event on May 6 -7. After a quick introduction at the lab each morning, MVAC archaeologist Connie Arzigian and the crew headed out to the field. LeVern DeVries provided a presentation on lithics and raw materials during the lunch hour. After lunch and more surveying, the artifacts were washed back at the lab, and everyone was able to see what had been collected from each field.


One new upland site was discovered with several flakes collected along with the base of an early (possibly Paleo) projectile point. One known site in the Long Coulee area was re-visited, resulting in a large amount of stone flakes and several tools collected. Other fields in the Holmen area were also surveyed, and many artifacts were recovered, despite poor surveying conditions. According to Connie, those people who come back each year "really know what they're doing," and they never give up on finding artifacts.
