

SA1516-050: Resolution Requesting One Non-binding Referendum on the April 12 Student Election Ballot

WHEREAS; the April 12 student election ballot may be amended to include referendums that are both binding and non-binding;

WHEREAS; it is of interest to see student opinion on the idea of a personal safety application for student use;

WHEREAS; Vice Chancellor Bob Hetzel and Chief of Police Scott McCullough have both requested input from the student body as to whether or not they would make use of a safety application that was personalized for the UW-L campus;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED; the Student Senate approves the following non-binding question to appear on the April 12 student election ballot:

Would you use and be in favor of a personalized phone application that gives students immediate contact with police in an emergency situation, provides means to report crimes or tips, assists in learning about on campus resources and provides a means for friends/police to monitor you when walking (safewalk)? (Yes/No response)
