i. Hi everyone my name is Caity and I am from tri sigma which is a social sorority. We are really looking for a leader to start this sorority at campus so I am here until November 13th to talk to anyone interested in becoming involved. Please just send me an email to set up a time to talk.

b. Green Fund

i. Hi my name is Rachel Stefan and I am the green fund coordinator. I am just going to tell you a little about the green fund. So everyone pays a seg. fee to the green fund which goes towards sustainability which is roughly about \$6.20 – the process is: it goes to JCES and if it passes there then it goes into SUFAC and then last year when it got to SUFAC some of them were not approved because we cannot have any landscaping applications. Right now we do have \$123,000 and the reason for that is last year we only had a few large projects happen but we were able to get a lot of funding and a lot of people were allowed to keep their jobs but last year the reason we have so much is that last year not all projects got approved from SUFAC. So we did actually finish up paying for the lighting in the new student union and we are putting a plaque in there.

ii. So we are really excited about the new projects going on campus. One project not listed is when the green fund was first initiated there was a vermicomposter made and it is a large compost processing center that has saved a lot of money and is a huge sustainability on campus. Right now we cannot have it at campus. Previously it was at TC but now it is at the Mayo. People think that this doesn't affect them but it does huge things for people and we were also able to create 2 new internships from this. Even though you don't see a lot of this happen there really is a lot of things



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going on in campus. We got new shower heads a couple of years ago which has saved a lot of money but these things do affect students directly.

a. Gross: You said that there were 2 smaller projects, what are they?

- 1. We have a project at the rec and with new solar panels.
- b. What would the new solar panels be used for1. For the rec addition, for more sustainable lighting.

iii. Fish: Hello every one, in case. What I am going to talk about today is talk about student staff. I wanted to talk to all of you today to there are info nights on Nov. 14 and 15. I have a timeline with me and if you want more information about this you can contact me. We are trying to get more diverse students in the res halls. People have been talking about tokenism and we are working hard to have a more diverse staff to help the students. We are looking at issues that happen that make students who are diverse not apply

1. Fish: We are going to organizations and we have been talking to people about tokenism and how to prevent it.

VII. Officer Reports

a. President: Jacob Schimmel

i. Hello, So I'll just say that the election is over and I think everyone is happy about that. Regardless of who was elected there was going to be some tension, so as a result of this there has definitely been some tension so in my nonpartisan role I think it is very important to try to be civil in everything we do. I know this disheartens me and everyone else. We should just try to support the president that was elected, regardless of who. We'll see what are president chooses when choosing rhetoric. Let's just make sure that we take steps to make the campus as safe as possible.
1. Bhatoya: What other steps have been taken other than emails?

a. Schimmel: Regarding the hate crime that happened,



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police and administrators are currently on this. It is obviously a hate crime. As a role in SA we don't have a ton of say in what happens. But it shouldn't take instances that just happened to get people to start talking about this. Pat and I are looking at creating another statement. Stevens Point sent out a great letter with where and what they want to see done. At the beginning of the year with the banner, we have learned that the power of words is very powerful. Pat and I have had discussions with campus climate about how disgusting

1. Bhatoya: What are the policies regarding hate crimes?

a. Schimmel: I don't have that information right now but Dr. Larry do you?

b. Ringgenberg: We will prosecute if at all possible but we have multiple people working on this. I've been having discussions about what students need and how we can help and we are focusing on getting students opinions on what they want to happen.

c. Schimmel: Right now a lot of students of color don't feel safe but right now I feel I can work on helping to make the campus feel safer.

2. Arney: I just want to say that other means should be used to handle this situation. We shouldn't just fix this issue and go back to the way things used to be I think that it should be addressed in a different way. I don't know if that means an inclusive training with everyone on campus.

a. Schimmel: I think that we would have to do an open forum but the sad thing is that most the people there it's like preaching to the choir. I know a lot of people aren't feeling safe but we are exploring a variety of options. Should we work on getting services to escort people to campus to feel safer? I'm open to anything and Pat and I are working on statements of what I want to see in general. I want to reiterate that people can say what they want but this was a hate crime and we just have to make sure that the rhetoric that we say is addressing that in the best way possible. Feel free to talk to me at any point and I am open to talking to anyone. I'll just say that I plan on having a resolution next week about our budget going forward. I would also like to thank the SRDs that signed up and really helped out. The line was not that long at all and I cannot thank you enough. Last thing, search and screen policy that we had been going over, we have defined "diversity" in a more specific way so that it is clear. I am always open to people coming to talk to me about what is 'sufficiently diverse"

b. Vice President: Patrick Brever



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i. I'll just echo what was said regarding the incident today and I am also willing to talk. I also wanted to ask people about ideas about cutting down meeting times, please keep in mind that there are some things that we have to do. People have been talking about guest speakers as well.
