#### VII. Officer Reports

- a. President: Jacob Schimmel
  - i. Schimmel- I only have one thing this week which has to do with scholarships. I worked with Greg to make two scholarships that would go to incoming freshman. So these are \$1,000 and have to do with leadership so any student qualifies from high school with skills and extra circulars. Admissions will look through the candidates and limit it to 10 and sent it to SA to select the 2 folks who will be awarded the scholarship. I am talking to Greg to increase the values but this is the first year SA has input and here on after they will do that as well. Preference would go to one that needs financial help so the 10 finalist would hopefully be folks in need. I wanted to form a committee, we don't have to go through a formal process, it's a temporary committee with maybe 5 people. So folks who are interested, won't meet more than twice, to talk about the 10 and hammer it down to 2. Once you do that, me and who ever is VP will be calling the awardees and let them know they go the scholarship.

#### VIII. Advisor Reports

a. Larry- really some previous things. They brought in another table but it was the wrong color. About a year ago when we started negotiating with EG we made a case that we didn't have them because they weren't flexible enough with what the students needed. They did some of that, but this fall semester finally we have e and g in agreement that you can have any sandwich heated and they will do that for you. This is going to be a test case for all their sandwiches. We aren't advertising it but just so you know. They worry is



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that there could be a long line. We have been busy on the food services, I haven't had any questions or concerns.

- i. Lang- do you know how long we have contracts with food vendors and for how long? Is there any talk about bring back Red mango?
  - 1. Larry- The way it works is Chartwells has contracts with the other groups, we've had many conversations about red mango. We have talked about putting it in the rec after their renovation when they have more space. Not a lot of water in the strength station however, would sacrifice to get the water need. Red mango said for them excel, they would need \$200,000 in profit a year and that's a lot of smoothies. We are back in conversation and some will be comin. Couple possibilities of putting it in this building at a much reduced price than would be in the REC, it is about money and everything. At some point we will be coming back and talking to the committee. I'm frustrated with the concession stand. I see organizations leaving with 78 cents because that's all they've made and that doesn't make sense to me.

The whole thing is that the original concept was suppose to be a collaboration space where different organizations could come together and talk about issues. Hopefully people come together and talk about stuff.

#### XII. New Business

- a. SA1718-028: Resolution to Support General Education Program Revision
  - i. Lauren- faculty have asked us to give our formal opinion on the general education program revision. And then the revision is on the back of the resolution, this is just to support if you like the proposal and it really affects students.
    - 1. Dani- my constituents were wondering how we got from our current requirement down to what we will be. I want to know what went into that decision
      - a. Lauren- so why they decided to reduce the credit load, if you go through the document you only hit 39 credits, but the minimum about you need to complete is 48 so it doesn't make sense because students take them in their major. Also we have the highest minimum requirement in the UW system by at lease 6 credits so we want to make it better, but also we didn't see that gap as effective. Some of the courses that you think may be effected will still be offered. They are still going to try to do things to make that relevant
    - 2. Haley- there is still substantial difference about how we have the highest credit lead and this still puts us at the tip.
    - 3. Added as a sponsor- Jillian, Justice, Weaver, Avery, Dani, Brandon, Isaac, Lang, Kyle
    - 4. Sabah- is it based on your major
      - a. Lauren- Based on the topic of the course, the 111 is something recorded and records saw that nothing else is called 111 so you know it's a first year seminar
        - i. Sabah- Do they focus on effects on that in the seminar
          - 1. Lauren- Smaller course and you can pick which one you want
    - 5. Ethan- would this be getting rid of classes
      - a. Lauren- not sure how it will end up effecting students, so a lot of the gen eds were overlapping core classes for your major and we wanted to separate them and a lot of coursees were put in gen ed to double count but that's not the purpose so this is to help that be more defined
        - i. Ethan- I would be against anything cutting the amount of courses students take.
    - 6. Amy- so like if this were to pass and would be enforced, would the current students have to take it or would they be grandfathered in?
      - a. Lauren- They still have to do the 48 credits, because when you come in you get a catalog, so it would be a transitional thing.
    - 7. Dani- for the first year seminar, what about those without a major?
      - a. Lauren- It doesn't correlate with your major



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- 8. Haley- by reducing this amount, you still need 120 to graduate
  - a. Lauren- yes

- c. Colin- a student in tri sigma, Amilia Wagner, has an idea. We don't have a big homecoming event and I'm wondering your opinion on that. She says our campus have our different sex we don't intermingle, we have Oktoberfest but we don't have anything other than that.
  - i. Justice- what activities would they have
    - 1. Colin- Not sure yet but she just wanted to see what people thought
  - ii. Haley- I think it would be a good thing to have every committee do something
  - iii. Lucas- you always hear our homecoming isn't big is because of Oktoberfest, so my thing is we don't have a spring festival so maybe put it then so we aren't competition with Oktoberfest
  - iv. Alicia- at my friends' college for both the homing and spring jam they do a concert and they have stuff were groups set up and get to know them.
  - v. Brandon-The terms of when and where could be later but I think right now it could go a long way and bring the campus together and deal with school stuff
  - vi. Dani- I don't think we shoud compete with Oktoberfest also there is an



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involvement fest in the spring as well as fall. Maybe something like a mayday fair? So, if they want to do something like that I think coordinating with the COVE leadership they have an eye for planning events.

- d. Jacob- we need to have an open line of thought because we can't not have a VP I need to have a reason to why I shouldn't re-nominate Weston. What I've seen he's conducted himself and I want to hear some perspective from those who voted no. I need to know where you want to go with this. I'm graduating in the spring and I want this institution to be strong. I need feedback and I would like to hear respectively where they want this spot to go.
- e. Lauren- would you like Weston to step out
  - i. Lang-I think Weston should step out and I think some would be more comfortable
- f. Ethan- so I talked to a lot of people about this and from what I heard, people wouldn't vote because they don't know where he stands on issues. They were worried about breaking a tie and didn't know if they would vote his way and I think that is wrong.
- g. Lang- with the people that sit around this table we can't say we represent everyone I know that is an exhausting thing to do, I don't see how the VP, this individual represents the not only the students in this room and their constituents, along with the entire campus.
- h. Isaac- I have an issue with the procedure with how this works. We have the President and VP in the same, work in cohesion, but the difference is the vice president runs the show and they preside over the legislative bodies. And to me I see that as something that shouln't be tied to our executive branch. SO I think it would be wise instead of the vice president leading the motions and the meetings, we should have somenone that is outside the executive branch. If something like this happens again, in our bylaws we should have the option to call for a special election. If we had the option later on it would be easier. I think there is a lot that needs to be to be changed and the separation of power is my biggest issue.
  - i. Lauren- the VP would break a tie in the federal government
    - 1. Isaac- VP being the one who runs the executive branch I don't know, I think we should choose who does that.
    - 2. Lauren- we are talking about filling the position and restructuring the position is not why we are voting
    - 3. Schimmel- I think it's fine talking about restructuring, but I think that we need a VP to facilitate meetings and stuff like that and that is a separate issue right now and addressing it to the student body takes time. Its out of the fact that you need efficient and power and I think it's necessary to have a quick transition. I guess for me I want to her perspective about immediately going forward. I need to appoint the vice president and if you're not comfortable with Weston I would hope you would be comfortable letting me know so I can know what to do going forward.

- i. Brandon- the fact of the matter is we do have Colin and taking on that responsible he could be okay with taking the weight of that position until we decide who will take that spot and that is why I voted no
- j. Alfanzo- they don't have enough to make a conclusive decisions, but for the past 2 terms



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I've worked for him and he's done an amazing job and I was confused why we didn't make 2/3 and if you need more information you should really be asking questions

- k. Malik-could one of us make a resolution to request and VP, what about Brittney
  - i. Lauren- She in a part of senate, has three jobs and in a sorority it's not feasible for her to do.
- 1. Dani- my constituents and I had a Q and A and that's why I voted Yes. I've know Weston since I got here and I understand that our process is flawed and that's why we're editing it and I understand the concept of the role and he would have all the power. All the conversations I've had and the way he answer the question, he didn't take a side and he wants to know more and that's why I voted yes and I understand why people said no and our processes is flawed but I think he should our representative.
  - i. Jacob- I want to do an informal vote, I want to know if it was procedural or they didn't like the candidate. If it's a procedural issue ill re-nominate. If I can, can I get a hand rate for the ones that said no for a procedural no
    - 1. Haley- I think it was both, to ask for that reason it would be calling out the people who voted no, there was a reason we asked for a secret ballet
    - 2. Lauren- we need to know what to do moving forward and what you need, if it's a different candidate because we need to get someone here, so how do we move forward.
    - 3. Brandon- as far as moving forward, we have someone to sit in your spot while this is discussed and I would feel more comfortable utilizing the person we have for that position in this situation.
      - a. Lauren- what would you be doing while Colin is in the position, so we need to figure out what everyone needs to move forward and not just have Colin here now
    - 4. Ethan- I think you should re-nominate Weston. I don't see that it's our say to reject him its out job to put him through.
      - a. Lauren- yes its your job to confirm him but you also need to make sure that he is a good fit
    - 5. Jillian- I think someone new should be nominated, some have focused on outreach and talking to people and getting to know our campus and have build a relationship with everyone and everyone seems comfortable with that person. Personally I voted no, I would feel more comfortable with a lot of other people over them that I think should be considered I don't know if people would change their vote in the future so it would make this process longer

- v. Schimmel- no matter who the candidate is, is that going to change your vote? I don't want to be in a situation where people are voting it down because they don't like the procedure
- vi. Lauren- I don't want this room run by three people I understand your concerns.

  Just because one person says no I don't want the rest to follow. I don't want to be hurtful
- vii. Colin- I think we are going around circles and tensions are high and feeling might be hurt, so I'm going to move to end discussion
  - 1. Seconded by Malik
  - 2. Objected by Brandon
    - a. Brandon- there are people that have things they want to say and we have a right to voice them
- viii. Haley- beside the procedurals aspects I think the voices I've heard are "no I don't want Weston" its not that I don't have 100% faith in his succession. What I've heard its more so I don't see him representing senate and there's no concrete way of saying this. The conversation I've had is just it's not all the way there.
  - 1. Lauren- do you think a different candidate would be beneficial
    - a. Haley yes
