- V. Guest Speakers: Chris Paul, Relay for Life

- VII. Officer Reports
 - a. President: Jacob Schimmel
 - i. Jacob-First, on the election thing, I have been in contact with Andy and I'll be sure that you're in that meeting. We are just going over the basics and he helps run everything. The election bylaws are different and there has to be a 2 class weeks in between so they can get signatures, something to look into. I plan to go to classrooms to talk to students about running for stuff. I will do my own campaigning to get people interested in these positions. When we have more candidates, people pay more attention. If you want to be looped in on that let me know. Secondly, I've been working with Barb Stewart on a multicultural scholarship in the division and they rely off of funding form the outside and they have ran into difficulties finding the funding. Basically on top of that there is a the way we could create scholarships that opened up and we can use that money.



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I'm looking to transfer that money over to the scholarship and looking to make it as efficient as possible. We are working on creating new scholarships with the businesses in the area and will be meeting with businesses. It will be a new women's funds scholarship, utilizing women owned businesses in the community. If I can get \$20 for each or half of those businesses you could get a \$500 scholarship in the CBA program. On top of that I was thinking if we could get it in, getting a more permanent scholarship committee, which is contingent on getting the money. Lastly, the PT program in the health center, Bob wants to eliminate the program to save money because he sees it as a luxury service. He doesn't see it as a recruiting tool for the university. I talked to the chancellor and he takes the same side but a different approach. They are looking to do it through attrition. I think we'll have to keep that in mind, eliminating positions. I want you to be aware of that for when Bob comes in. I want to put a survey into the student election asking if they value the PT program. The chancellor said can be moved by student opinion. My plan with that is working with Bob and Joe and show you guys what it looks like. The chancellor is looking for an adequate amount of information from both ends, why it would be a good idea to keep it or leave it.

- 1. Jillian- my constituents wanted me to look into how the health center would be moved
 - a. Jacob- Could be the same thing. The reason they haven't done this is the restructuring of the system and management at the health center.
 - i. Jillian- Do you think he would want the health center to take over some of the roles
 - 1. Jacob- it's a fair question, I don't have a good perspective on it. I could shoot him an email on that
- 2. Haley- Why is bob looking at eliminating it at a broad sense
 - a. Jacob- He wants to grow the university but find ways to save money without damaging the quality of the school. The PT proem is a luxury in comparison to what other schools provide. Bob and Joe look at the services that the university provides getting students to come here and the PT program doesn't do anything substantial to bring students here
 - i. Haley- I sat in a meeting and from their perspective, the PT program is bringing students here.
 - 1. Jacob- I don't know if it's on the move, but the interm director is also the PT guy, but I would say its two different perspectives. The health center isn't making money off of the PT program and you can talk to him about it when he comes in.
- 3. Jillian- I think we have a big masters program for PT and they are going through this program and it brings student to campus
 - a. Jacob- I'm not 100% but the people that were doing the PT



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program were not interning. Another thing to keep in mind

- 4. Alicia- Bob thinks it's not going to effect the PT master's program
 - a. Not to him no, he sees it as something separate to the academic program

XIII. Discussion

- a. Sabah- I was talking to my constitutions and they were concerned about how there is no diversity training for the faculty and its important because teachers need to know how to communicate with their students. One said it's not a requirement to make it mandatory because then anyone who doesn't do it gets fired. I'm just confused why it's not a requirement, maybe because there is no liability
 - i. Kallis- I think it stems from faculty not having that training and understanding, but it could be brought into a conversation with Betsy.

 - iii. Aaron- I'm going to faculty senate and I can ask them that question
- b. Kallis- Talking about things going on in the university and I don't know if this the best discussion to have. Talked about Ray Cross is the UW system president. In emailed him and talked about the process of shared government and why he didn't involve the other governance in the merger process. He said there were no faculty or student involvement because it would slow down the process. Within shared governance our power was stripped. He basically said there in no point to use it. UW- Stout recently passed a vote of no confidence of Ray Crosse and I think that is something we should do. I know the people who wrote that bill and he is going to send me the bill. We should have a discussion on who is in charge of the UW system we are the ones it is effecting and our voices are being minimized
 - i. Jacob- Isn't a uniform behind the no confidence there are a lot of places. I called him when this was going on and he said students would have a say in this and other students have talked to him and they haven't had success and it is more of an internal process. So I'm not happy about that but I'm cautious getting behind a no confidence. He has done a good job at mitigating that amount of funding. I don't think I can see myself signing that, I'm leaning toward vetoing something like that. Ray has been as good of an advocate as a president can be and I don't know a replacement for Cross.
