VII. Officer Reports

- a. President: Benjamin O'Connell
  - i. O'Connell: Talking more about draft bills, one of them is for part time students to pay reduced seg fees, this would make seg fees for part time students charged on a per credit basis. After looking this over, we ended up not in favor of this for several reasons – for example, somebody taking less credits might be paying less in seg fees but may use the rec everyday versus somebody taking more credits and paying more for the rec but may never use it. This could also potentially hurt different programs that we have due to reduction in seg fees, So, we'd like to let them know how this could detrimentally affect the university. Another potential bill is about voter protection, this one would look to extend protections in a voter protection act and would create universal voter registration when you turn 18 and increase penalties for voter intimidation. With elections coming up, start telling folks about running for Student Association, nom papers will be out on March 12<sup>th</sup>. Gender neutral restrooms, by the end of the summer, will be in Wings and the CFA. I'll be talking about the inflatable dome later in discussion, it would be useful in winter for athletics. We just want to brainstorm thoughts on this and get some feedback for Bob.
- b. Vice President: Haley Jurecki
  - i. Jurecki: If you are visiting clubs let me know when, if you get any feedback you can then pass it along to me. Also, let them know about elections coming up. Ben and I met about counseling and testing. Just some updates, we're looking at more funding for counseling and testing by UWS so we can be better supporters of mental health and be able to support more students. Students are being turned away for weeks at a time, so the goal is trying to fix that and expand counseling and testing. We will also do a quick refresher on parliamentary procedure.
- c. Chief of Staff: Lucas Marinack
  - i. Marinack: Heartthrob will be at 7p.m. tomorrow in the bluffs room. It is for women's heart health and is \$7 at the door. Dean meetings with CSH I'd like to set up times with most of you sometime soon. Also, with reservations, if you
