SA1920-021: Resolution Endorsing the Reaching Higher for Higher Ed Bill Package

WHEREAS college affordability and accessibility are critical in Wisconsin and allow citizens to receive higher education and advance the Wisconsin Idea; and

WHEREAS between 2011 and 2017, the cumulative cuts to the UW-System have totaled over \$795 million and have limited several institutions' abilities to support students, as well as recruit and retain quality academic faculty; and

WHEREAS the effects of the UW-System budget cuts include reduced class offerings, limited support programs, increased class sizes, and reduced professor and student contact time – all resulting in increased time for students to earn a degree at UW – La Crosse; and

WHEREAS a continued tuition freeze will require a substantial state funding increase over the next biennium to meet the future needs of the UW-System and offset previous funding cuts System-wide; and

WHEREAS increased funding to the UW-System is essential to meet the needs of the Wisconsin workforce, to raise awareness of high-demand fields, and to keep Wisconsin students in Wisconsin rather than losing them to neighboring states; and

WHEREAS upon passage of AB-387, starting in the 2021-22 academic year, no freeze on the amount the Board of Regents may charge for resident undergraduate tuition at UW System institutions may take effect unless the freeze is offset by a corresponding increase in the amount of GPR funding appropriated to the Board of Regents; and

WHEREAS upon passage of AB-389, a UW Blue Ribbon Commission would be established to create a set of long-term goals and priorities for higher education; and accessibility and affordability of higher education in Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS upon passage of AB-390, the state would provide an additional \$27 million in GPR funding for Wisconsin grants for UW System students in each year of the 2019-21 biennium; and

WHEREAS upon passage of AB-391, the state would provide full remission of undergraduate tuition to resident undergraduate students enrolled in a teaching program at a UW System school during the student's semester of student teaching; and

WHEREAS upon passage of AB-392, the state would provide an additional \$16.8 million in GPR funding in the 2019-2020 biennium, and \$33.6 million in the 2020-2021 biennium to the UW System; and

WHEREAS the Reaching Higher for Higher Education legislative bill package would greatly increase the quality of education for students at UW - La Crosse, as well as all UW System students.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED the University of Wisconsin – La Crosse Student Association endorses the Reaching Higher for Higher Ed bill package introduced by Representative Shankland and Senator Hansen;

THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the University of Wisconsin – La Crosse Student Association calls on the Wisconsin State Assembly, and the Wisconsin State Senate, to pass this package of bills (AB-387, AB-388, AB-389, AB-390, AB-391, and AB-392) and adequately fund the UW System on top of the tuition freeze already in place.

1 AN ACT to create 36.27 (1m) of the statutes; relating to: resident undergraduate

tuition freezes for the University of Wisconsin System.

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Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill prohibits from taking effect any limitation on the amount the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System may charge for resident undergraduate tuition unless the limitation is offset by a corresponding increase in the amount of general purpose revenues appropriated to the Board of Regents. The prohibition first applies beginning in the 2021–22 academic year.

AN ACT to amend 15.01 (2); and to create 15.06 (1) (f), 15.06 (3) (a) 7., 15.915 (4) and 36.67 of the statutes; relating to: creating a Blue Ribbon Commission in the University of Wisconsin System.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill creates a 19-member Blue Ribbon Commission in the University of Wisconsin System. Members of the commission include the president of the UW System, four faculty and four academic staff members of UW System schools that the UW System has identified as underserved or undergoing significant programmatic changes, four UW System students, one higher education expert, one workforce development expert, and four legislators. The commission must study, and facilitate discussion of, a public agenda for higher education; a set of long-term goals and priorities for higher education; and accessibility and affordability of higher education. In addition, the commission must do all of the following: 1) define the goals of higher education for this state; 2) identify strengths to continue and expand, and weaknesses that need to improve, in this state's institutions of higher education; 3) identify demographic trends that will affect all institutions of higher education in this state; 4) identify a new funding structure or new revenue streams for the UW System; 5) identify new ways to administer financial aid; 6) offer recommendations to encourage and develop innovations among institutions of higher education; 7) offer recommendations to encourage and develop partnerships between institutions of higher education; 8) offer recommendations to encourage more students to seek higher education; 9) study the success rate of programs designed to increase

retention in this state's work force of this state's graduates; 10) study the success rate of programs designed to increase accessibility of higher education; and 11) study the feasibility of establishing a state program to provide debt-free college education to all Wisconsin residents. The commission must submit a report to the legislature that includes all of this information by December 31, 2022. Upon submission of the report, the commission terminates, unless the governor renews the commission for an additional two-year period. The governor may continue to renew the commission for successive two-year periods.

This bill increases the appropriations for Wisconsin grants for University of Wisconsin System students and technical college students.

Under current law, the Wisconsin grant program, administered by the Higher Educational Aids Board, provides grants to postsecondary resident students enrolled at least half time and registered as freshmen, sophomores, juniors, or seniors in specified postsecondary institutions, including UW schools and technical colleges.

This bill increases HEAB's biennial appropriation for Wisconsin grants for UW students by \$27,000,000 in each year of the 2019-21 fiscal biennium and for technical college students by \$18,000,000 in each year of the 2019-21 fiscal biennium.
