a. Julie Nelson

i. Nelson: I am the community engagement coordinator for Great Rivers United Way which is chapter of the world-wide organization. Our mission is to unite people and resources to liven communities, and I want to encourage students to get involved. We want to lift people out of poverty. We do this by giving money to nonprofits who donate to those causes. For example, the Salvation Army can't do what they do without Coulee Cap, providing housing and taking support from the local food banks. However, they don't have experience with addiction and domestic abuse, which is where they would turn to organizations in our community who specialize in these areas. United way provides funding for all these programs so that we can help communities work to eliminate poverty from all fronts. On top of that, we do community engagement activities that try to make the community safer. For example, we did a "vote safe" program with a UWL professor this previous election. It was an online event and we had lots of people who talked about how to vote safely and make sure that your vote is counted. Before COVID, we did a poverty simulation. This involves getting a bunch of people in a room and each are given the identity of a person who is in poverty. It could be a dad who just came out of jail, a single mom, or anyone who could be experiencing poverty in real life. You have to work make ends meet and following the system. It really shows that there is more to getting out of poverty than just getting a job.

I am trying to get a student united group from UWL, Viterbo and Western. We will do our own fundraising or help at other fundraisers. We will try to do some social events when COVID is done as well. This Sunday we have a plan for an event, we will meet at the south branch of the public library and do a "Rake and Run". Pretty much, we knock on people's doors who look like they have a lot of leaves in their yard and ask them if they want free help. If they do, we rake their leaves and then run on to the next house. Additionally, we are looking for someone to serve on our board. Right now, we are looking a lot at equity and inclusion so if that is something you would be interested in, please let me know. They meet once a month on the fourth Thursday from 4-5:30 except in November and December, when they move it up a week for the holidays. The student is a valuable voice to have represented.
