- 1. Approve request for Volleyball Tournament from Ali Tackett, Coordinator of Competitive Sports
 - a. We received a memo that reads: "Recreational Sports is seeking approval from the Student Services and Buildings Committee for use of the REC on Saturday, Nov. 13, 2021, to support the annual men's and women's Eagle Open volleyball tournament. Since 2014, we have been given approval by the committee to close the courts on the first level, granting access to all six volleyball courts. With the addition of the multiactivity court (MAC) on the upper level, there is still an opportunity for open recreation (basketball, volleyball, soccer, etc.) in the building, so we do not foresee this closure as a concern for UWL students. The tournament is open to 12 men's and 12 women's clubs from around the Wisconsin Volleyball Conference (WVC). The WVC includes most UW institutions, Lakeland College, Carroll University, Marquette University, Concordia University-Wisconsin, Moody Bible Institute, and Northland International University. The tournament would consist of a one-day format with pool play in the morning and a single elimination bracket in the afternoon. With 24 possible teams and all six courts, setup and practice would start at 7am and the championship contests would end around 9pm. In association with the Rec Sports Department, the volleyball clubs will use the tournament as a fundraiser to aid in travel to the National Collegiate Volleyball Federation National Championship in April 2022, where both clubs look to contend for national championship titles.
