# **History of the Council**

The council was established in 2009 as the Classified Staff Advisory Council. Its purpose was serve as an advisory group to the Chancellor and administrators on behalf of classified staff and to give a voice to classified staff outside of union representation. In December 2012, the word advisory was dropped from the title and Classified Staff Council became an official shared governance group at UWL. In July 2015, a state statutory change led to another name change and the council became known as University Staff Council (USC).

UW-La Crosse University Staff Council (USC) works to bridge the gap between university staff and administration, to represent university staff in the campus decision making process, to promote ongoing education and professional development activities for all university staff employees.
