


#### Volunteer Request: University Staff Representative to sit on UWL's Community Engagement Council (CEC)

The CEC serves as the primary advisory committee for UWL's Community Engagement Coordinator. The committee is composed of faculty, staff, students and community members interested in fostering collaborations between UWL and the larger community. In particular, there is a focus on fostering experiential learning and research collaborations for undergraduate and graduate students in and out of the classroom with community partners. In addition, the committee should reflect faculty/staff community involvement related to scholarship, professional development and/or service. The Community Engagement Coordinator will convene the committee at least once a semester and would provide a brief annual report on the activities to the Chancellor, VC Advancement, Provost and Faculty Senate Chair. More often reports may be required by the Strategic Planning Coordinator.

The council meets at least once a semester, but does receive email requests from Lisa Klein for thoughts and advice a couple of times each semester.
