Upcoming Events & Opportunities

Employee COVID-19 testing for Spring 2021

Effective February 1, 2021, all employees who will be on campus at least one day a week will be required to test for COVID-19 at the BinaxNOW testing center in Cartwright Center. Testing will be required once, in every two-week period beginning on February 1, 2021. More detailed information can be found on <u>HR's Employee COVID-19 Testing Requirements</u> page.

Take a look at the process through Britney, your Vice Chair's eyes:

1. First I'll need to register and sign up for an appointment at: <u>doineedacovid19test.com</u>. This site also has a handy video and PDF of <u>what to expect for a self-administered test</u>!

NOTE: Employees will be paid for the time needed to test and wait for their rapid test result **at the UWL BinaxNOW testing facility** on the third (3) floor of the Cartwright Center. You can test at other facilities but will need to be in charge of record keeping and may not be compensated of your time- check with HR.

2. As a UWL employee I enter at the <u>WEST entrance of</u> <u>Cartwright Center</u> and proceed to the 3rd floor. The elevator is accessible in the North Entrance vestibule. Follow the handy signs!

The West Entrance door faces Graff Main Hall and down the sidewalk from the traffic roundabout.

3. Upon check-in I get asked my Employee ID number- good thing I brought my Employee ID card! You can also find your number on your Earnings Statement.



4. Time to test! She explains how to swab my nostrils with the Q-Tip...it wasn't so bad!

5. I await my test results in the waiting area outside the testing room. I received an email to my UWL email about 15 minutes after testing. I follow the prompt to log back into my registration profile for my results.

I make sure to file the email notification so I can keep track of when I got tested.

Negative results mean I am good to go. Positive results will require me to head back to the front desk of Cartwright (passed them on the way in) and receive a PCR test. Make sure to



take the paper handouts on the way out!

In all the process went pretty smooth. All my questions and concerns were either addressed on the <u>HR</u> <u>Employee COVID-19 Testing Requirements page</u> or the <u>COVID-19 FAQ page</u>.
