Greetings UWL students, faculty and staff,

As a reminder, people 16 and older who live or work in Wisconsin are eligible to register for vaccination.

We have been informed that Mayo has a large number of open vaccine slots for the week of April 12th (next week). UWL employees and students are welcome to schedule an appointment through Mayo Patient Online Services, the Mayo Clinic App, or by calling [608-392-7400](tel:608-392-7400). The Mayo Clinic vaccine site is located in the Professional Arts Building at 11th and Ferry Street.

Our other local vaccination providers continue to offer appointments:
