Executive Order 54 (E054) Reports

Purpose: For individuals to report incidents of abuse/neglect involving minors. Individuals can learn more about EO54 and definitions of abuse/neglect by visiting our website.

How/Where to Report: Contact 911 if an emergency. For non-emergency situations, contact the University Police Department (608-785-9000) or local Child Protective Services (608-784-4357).

A E054 Report must also be submitted if an incident is linked to a youth activity. The report is linked on the UWL Youth Protection and Title IX pages.

UWL Incident Reports

Purpose: For individuals to report the following incidents:

- injuries (adult staff)
- Property Damage (by adult staff)
- Other program concerns/incidents (adult staff)

How/Where to Report: General Incident Report is linked on the UWL Business Services website.

Youth/Camp Incident Reports

Purpose: For individuals to report the following incidents involving minors:

- Injuries
- Property DamageTitle IX Incidents/Concerns
- Behavioral Concerns/Conduct
- Illegal Drug Use
- Other program concerns/incidents
- Noncompliance with youth protection requirements.

Individuals can learn more about <u>Title IX</u> and <u>Youth</u> Protection requirements by visiting our website.

How/Where to Report: Youth Incident Report is linked on the UWL Youth Protection website.

Program Directors should train their program staff on the following prior to the youth activity:

- Who must report?
- What is abuse and neglect?
- What is Title IX?
- When do I report?
- How do I report?

When a report is submitted, campus staff in key positions are notified and will follow up (usually within 24 hours) with the reporter, program director and/or other parties as appropriate.
