Thorelli was a professor in the College of Business Administration at UWL and was active in the community, volunteering with the School District of La Crosse and other local organizations.

Janice "Jan" M. Larkin died April 8 at age 89. Larkin worked at UWL until her retirement in 1993. She enjoyed reading, mahjong, golf, crossword puzzles, walking her dog, spending time with family and friends, and volunteering at Mayo Clinic Health System.

Michael H. Egle died March 6 at age 84. Egle was one of the founding professors of UWL's Computer Science Department and went on to teach for 32 years. He helped pioneer the large lecture/small group concept for introductory level courses and recorded hundreds of TV lectures through the years. Egle was also known for speed-walking through campus and enjoyed greeting people on his route.

Charles Frederick Hosler Jr.

Charles Frederick Hosler Jr. died June 7 at age 85. Hosler was a professor of biochemistry at UWL for 34 years. Outside of work, Hosler taught Sunday school and performed in the church choir, shared his love of woodworking with his children and grandchildren, and was a Cub Scout and Boy Scout leader.
