Fond du Lac Area Retired Educators 2021 Scholarship Cover Sheet

Since 1988, more than \$77,000 in scholarships has been awarded by the Fond du Lac Area Retired Education Association (FAREA) to deserving students who wish to pursue a career in the field of education. For 2021, FAREA is again offering scholarships to both public high school seniors and to university/college students.

Public high school seniors, residing in Fond du Lac County and who will be attending a university/college with a DPI accredited School of Education, are eligible for \$500 scholarships.

Scholarships will also be awarded to university/college students, who graduated from a Fond du Lac County public high school and who have been accepted into an accredited School of Education at the university/college they are attending.

High school applicants should provide:

- A completed 2021 FAREA application.
- A certified transcript of your high school grades and subjects taken.
- A copy of ACT or SAT test score results.
- Two letters of recommendation: one must be from the teacher of a class you attended; the second letter can be from a member of your community (suggestions: neighbor, family friend, employer, minister, youth worker) who is not related to you.
- A personal essay explaining a little about yourself, why you want to teach and why you should be given this scholarship.

College applicants should provide:

- A completed 2021 FAREA application.
- A certified transcript of your college courses and the grades earned.
- Copy of your letter of acceptance into the School of Education.
- Two letters of recommendation: one must be from the teacher of a class you attended in college; the second letter can be from a member of your community (suggestions: neighbor, family friend, employer, minister, youth worker) who is not related to you.
- A personal essay explaining a little about yourself, why you want to teach and why you should be given this scholarship.
