Passive Participation is not considered an alcohol violation on the first offense. Additional offenses with this charge will result in alcohol violations.

This chart outlines minimum expectations for typical violations; however, any single violation may result in more serious sanctions depending on the severity of that specific incident.

- If a student goes to the hospital for detoxification or has a BAC of .15 or higher, second offense alcohol sanctions should be issued.
- If a student is participating in "high-risk drinking games," second offense alcohol sanctions should be issued.

Alcohol policy violations committed by students under the age of 21 will result in parental/guardian notification in writing.

Disciplinary probation means that a student may remain enrolled at the University as long as the student complies with specified standards of conduct and completes all assigned disciplinary sanctions.

Review of housing contract could occur following any violation.
